DIRECTION

WHEREAS, the tanneries operating at the Calcutta Leather Complex, Dt. 24 Parganas (South) are causing serious environmental degradation through discharge of untreated as well as inadequately treated effluent.

WHEREAS, surprise inspections were conducted by officials of the WEST BENGAL POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD (hereinafter referred to as the Board) on 12/03/2010 at several tanneries located within the Calcutta Leather Complex. The observations are summarized below in tabular form.

WHEREAS, a technical hearing of the aforementioned tanneries was conducted by senior officials of the Board at the Head Office of the Board on 15/03/2010.

NOW THEREFORE, considering the observations made during the inspections and the submission made by the tanneries during the hearing, the following directions are issued by the Board with immediate effect.

The Secretary, WBSEDCL is requested to take necessary steps to disconnect the electricity connection of the six (06) tanneries (Sl. Nos. 1–6) immediately.

This direction is issued in exercise of the powers conferred under the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and Rules made thereunder.

The Closure Order against the aforementioned six (06) tanneries (Sl. Nos. 1–6) will take immediate effect and the Officer-in-Charge, Calcutta Leather Complex Police Station, South 24 Parganas under West Bengal Police is directed to execute the Closure Order against the aforementioned six (06) tanneries (Sl. Nos. 1–6) and submit the compliance report to the State Board within seven (07) days from the receipt of this Memo.

This direction has been issued to the Officer-in-Charge, Calcutta Leather Complex Police Station and the Director, WBSEDCL, Bidyut Bhawan, Kolkata in conformity with the order of the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta dated 21/08/1998 and 28/04/1999 respectively.

The Environmental Engineer, Salt Lake Regional Office of the State Board is requested to take necessary steps for proper execution of the order for closure and disconnection of electricity of the six (06) tanneries (Sl. Nos. 1–6) and visit the tanneries involving the local police station and Nodal Police Officer of the concerned district. He is also requested to ensure compliance of the directions by the other four (04) tanneries (Sl. Nos. 7–10) respectively.

This has the approval of the Competent Authority.
